The present invention relates to the field of an output device for a multimedia terminal, and more particularly to the field of a system and a method for controlling the output according to a user input in a multimedia terminal. In the field of a mobile terminal, there has been a rising tendency of a terminal including an image display unit for displaying an image such as an image of multimedia data (e.g., music, moving pictures, and broadcast images) as well as text data. As such, output devices equipped to the mobile terminal are increasingly diverse. The output devices include a display or speaker, a recording unit for printing, and a printer. Users of a mobile terminal may consider a position of an electronic device (e.g., a mobile terminal, an electronic book, or a tablet terminal) as important. It is desirable to provide, for example, a prompt for a user to turn on the output device according to a position of the electronic device, that is, a position of an upper surface of the electronic device.
